

LUKE 17-18 | Show Gratitude



17:11-18

What do we learn about gratitude from this incident?

- We should not only feel gratitude but also express it
- Sincere expressions of appreciation give evidence of Christian love and are a sign of good manners
- Those who wish to please Christ owe love and appreciation to all, regardless of nationality, race, or religion

Remember the Wife of Lot



Why did Lot's wife look back as she was fleeing Sodom? The Bible does not say. (Ge 19:17, 26) The context of Jesus' warning indicates that she may have longed for the things she left behind. (Lu 17:31, 32) How can we avoid losing God's favor as Lot's wife did? We must not allow a quest for material comforts to become our priority. (Mt 6:33) Jesus taught that we "cannot slave for God and for Riches." (Mt 6:24) But what if we detect that material things are starting to crowd out spiritual things in our life? We can pray to Jehovah for discernment to see where we need to make changes and for the courage and strength to do so.

LUKE 19-20 | Learn From the Illustration of the Ten Minas

19:12-24

What do the different features of the parable represent?

- 1 The master pictures Jesus
- 2 The slaves picture Jesus' anointed disciples
- 3) The money, which the master entrusts to the slaves, pictures the precious privilege of making disciples

This parable contains a warning about what would happen if Christ's anointed disciples developed the characteristics of a wicked slave. Jesus expects his disciples to use their assets fully in making more disciples.

Jesus Died for Your Brother Too



Jesus sacrificed his life for imperfect people. (Ro 5:8) No doubt we personally appreciate that Jesus showed his love for us by giving his life in our behalf. Nevertheless, at times we may need to remind ourselves that Christ died for our brother too. How can we show Christlike love to our brothers and sisters, who just like us are imperfect? Consider three ways. First, we can expand our circle of friends to include those whose background is different from ours. (Ro 15:7; 2Co 6:12, 13) Second, we can be careful to avoid saying or doing things that may offend others. (Ro 14:13-15) Finally, if someone sins against us, we can be guick to forgive. (Lu 17:3, 4; 23:34) If we work hard to imitate Jesus in these ways, Jehovah will continue to bless the congregation with peace and unity.

HOW TO DO IT:

- Use the "PUBLICATIONS" tab. Suppose that you are witnessing informally at school and you want to share with a classmate the brochure Answers to 10 Questions Young People Ask. Go to PUBLICATIONS > BOOKS & BROCHURES.
- Use the "ABOUT US" tab. Suppose that you are witnessing to a coworker who would like to read a brief explanation of our beliefs. Go to ABOUT US > FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS.
