DID YOU KNOW?

Although the Passover did not foreshadow the Memorial, certain features of the Passover have meaning for us. For example, the apostle Paul called Jesus "our Passover lamb." (1Co 5:7) Just as the lamb's blood on the doorframes saved lives, Jesus' blood saves lives. (Ex 12:12, 13) Also, not a bone of the Passover lamb was broken. Similarly, Jesus did not have any of his bones broken, even though this was a custom at such executions. -Ex 12:46: Joh 19:31-33, 36,

MARK 1-2 | "Your Sins Are Forgiven"



What do we learn from this miracle?

- Sickness is linked to inherited sin
- Jesus has the authority to forgive sins and the power to heal sick people
- Under the Kingdom, Jesus will remove imperfection and sickness forever

- Opening Comments (3 min. or less)

"Healing on the Sabbath": (10 min.)
 Mr 3:1, 2—The Jewish religious leaders were seeking a pretext to condemn Jesus (jy 78 ¶1-2)
 Mr 3:3, 4—Jesus knew that they had adopted an extreme, unscriptural view of the Sabbath law (jy 78 ¶3)

Mr 3:5—Jesus was "thoroughly grieved at the insensibility of their hearts" (nwtsty study note)

 Digging for Spiritual Gems: (8 min.)
 Mr 3:29—What does it mean to blaspheme against the holy spirit, and what are the consequences? (nwtsty study notes)

Mr 4:26-29—What can we learn from Jesus' illustration of the sower who sleeps? (*w14* 12/15 12-13 ¶6-8)

MARK 3-4 | Healing on the Sabbath



3:1-5

Why was Jesus thoroughly grieved by the attitude of the Jewish religious leaders? Because they made the Sabbath burdensome by adding countless lesser restrictions. For example, killing a flea was forbidden. Healing was lawful only if life was in danger. This meant that broken bones or sprains could not be treated on the Sabbath. Clearly, the religious leaders had no real concern for the man with the withered hand.



ASK YOURSELF:

'Do others view me as being rule oriented or as being compassionate?'

'When I see someone in the congregation who needs help, how can I imitate Jesus' compassion to a greater degree?'

Mr 5:38—The death of a loved one results in mourning

Mr 5:42—The future resurrection will cause "great

ecstasy" (*jy* 118 ¶6)

 Digging for Spiritual Gems: (8 min.)
 Mr 5:19, 20—Why might Jesus have departed from his usual instructions in this instance? (nwtsty study note on Mr 5:19)

Mr 6:11—What does it mean to "shake off the dirt that is on your feet"? (nwtsty study note)

• Bible Reading: (4 min. or less) Mr 6:1-13


Skillfully Use the Tools in Our Teaching Toolbox



Making a disciple is like building a house. To build effectively, we must learn to use our tools well. We especially need to develop skill in using our principal tool, God's Word. (2Ti 2:15) We also need to make effective use of the other publications and videos in our Teaching Toolbox—with the goal of making disciples.*

How can you improve in using the tools in our Teaching Toolbox? (1) Ask your field service group overseer for help, (2) work with an experienced publisher or pioneer, and (3) practice, practice, practice. As you become skilled at using these publications and videos, you will experience joy in the spiritual building work now taking place.

* A few publications that are not found in the Teaching Toolbox were written with a specific audience in mind. These may be used when appropriate.



Preaching and Teaching—Essential to Making Disciples

Jesus commanded his followers to go and make disciples. (Mt 28:19) This involves preaching and teaching. From time to time, we should all ask ourselves, 'How can I improve in these essential aspects of the disciple-making work?'





"Sow your seed in the morning and do not let your hand rest until the evening" (Ec 11:6)

PREACHING

Instead of waiting for people to come to us, we must actively search for "deserving" ones. (Mt 10:11) When we share in the ministry, are we alert to opportunities to speak with people who 'happen to be on hand'? (Ac 17:17) Lydia became a disciple as a result of the apostle Paul's diligent preaching.—Ac 16:13-15.

WATCH THE VIDEO CONTINUE PREACHING "WITHOUT LETUP"—INFORMALLY AND FROM HOUSE TO HOUSE. AND THEN ANSWER THE FOLLOWING QUESTIONS:

- In his daily routine, how did Samuel show that he was actively seeking to plant seeds of truth?
- Why must we persevere in all types of preaching?
- With whom might you share the Kingdom message during your daily routine?





"I planted, Apollos watered, but God kept making it grow" (1Co 3:6)

TEACHING

To make disciples, we must do more than simply leave literature with people. To help them progress spiritually, we need to make return visits and conduct Bible studies. (1Co 3: 6-9) Yet, what if our diligent efforts to teach someone Kingdom truth yield little results? (Mt 13:19-22) We should continue our search for those whose hearts are like "fine soil." —Mt 13:23; Ac 13:48.
