- When we practice giving, others will pour into our lap "a fine measure, pressed down, shaken together, and overflowing." This expression may refer to a custom of some vendors to fill a fold in the outer garment with purchased goods



LUKE 8-9 | Be My Follower—What Is Needed?

9:62

In order to make straight furrows, a plowman could not be distracted by what was behind him. Similarly, a Christian cannot allow himself to be distracted by the things that he left behind in the world.—Php 3:13.

When we experience difficulties, it is easy to long for 'the good old days,' perhaps the days before we came into the truth. When doing so, we often exaggerate the joys and minimize the problems of the past. That is what the Israelites did after they left Egypt. (Nu 11:5, 6) If we were to dwell on such thoughts, we could be tempted to return to our former way of life. How much better it is to count our present blessings and to focus on future joys under the Kingdom!—2Co 4:16-18.

LUKE 10-11 | The Parable of the Neighborly Samaritan

10:25-37

Jesus gave this parable in answer to the question: "Who really is my neighbor?" (Lu 10:25-29) He knew that the Christian congregation would come to be made up of "all sorts of" people—including Samaritans and Gentiles. (Joh 12:32) This parable taught his followers that they should go out of their way to show love to others, even those who may be very different from them.


