

Jeremiah in the gate of the house of Jehovah



7:1-4, 8-10, 15

- Jeremiah boldly exposed the Israelites' sins and hypocrisy
- The Israelites considered the temple to be a talisman that would protect them
- Jehovah let it be known that ritualistic sacrifices did not make up for wrong conduct

Consider: How can I make sure that my worship is in harmony with Jehovah's will and does not become formalistic?

- Because Israel's spiritual shepherds did not inquire of Jehovah, the people were scattered
- Those who followed Jehovah's direction had peace, happiness, and prosperity





Listen to God—How to Use It

The brochure *Listen to God* was designed to teach basic Bible truths visually to those who find it challenging to learn from text. Each two-page lesson features carefully prepared illustrations with arrows to guide the discussion from one illustration to the next.

The brochure Listen to God and Live Forever has the same illustrations as does Listen to God, but the former has more text and can be used by students who have some reading ability. Publishers often prefer to use it as a teacher's copy when their student is using Listen to God. Many of the pages contain a box with additional information that could be discussed, depending on the ability of the student.

You may offer either brochure at any time, even if it is not the offer for the month. When conducting a Bible study, use the illustrations to explain the Bible record. Ask questions to involve the student and to make sure he understands. Read and discuss the scriptures at the bottom of each page. After completing the brochure, study What Does the Bible Really Teach? or What Can the Bible Teach Us? to help your student progress to baptism.

Help Your Family to Remember Jehovah

Jeremiah was commissioned to warn the Jews of an impending destruction because they had forgotten their God, Jehovah. (Jer 13:25) How did the nation get to this sad spiritual state?  He hid it in the cleft of a crag, and he then returned to Jerusalem

13:6, 7


Jeremiah returned to the Euphrates River to retrieve the belt

The belt was ruined

13:8-11

Jehovah explained the matter after Jeremiah carried out the assignment

The brochure Who Are Doing Jehovah's Will Today? was designed to be considered with Bible students at the beginning or at the end of each study session.* Lessons 1 to 4 familiarize students with us as a people, lessons 5 to 14 help them learn about our activities, and lessons 15 to 28 show them our organization in action. It is generally best to consider the lessons in order unless a particular one deals with something of immediate interest. Each lesson is only a page long and can be discussed with most students in from five to ten minutes.

Have you noticed in the pictures in this brochure how well-dressed Jehovah's Witnesses are when attending their congregation meetings? Why do we pay such attention to


